INTERNATIONAL VOLUNTEER WORK

Since 2007, Mary has been going to Malawi, Africa with her husband to do volunteer work through Malawi Children's Village. Each year for 3 weeks, she has trained local physical therapists for the treatment of the pediatric population, as well as developing a Cerebral Palsy Clinic and Wheelchair Workshop at Malawi Children's village. Wheelchairs, walkers, as well as wooden chairs, tables and standers are now custom fabricated there by the welders and other experienced technicians at Malawi Children's village. Time is also spent providing education and training for the employees who go to 38 villages and spend time with families who have babies, toddlers or growing children who experience special needs or challenges with their overall development. This training is ongoing each year she returns.
